May 19th - Last day for seniors - commencement practice Commencement practice at 9:30 a.m. Report to the auditorium.

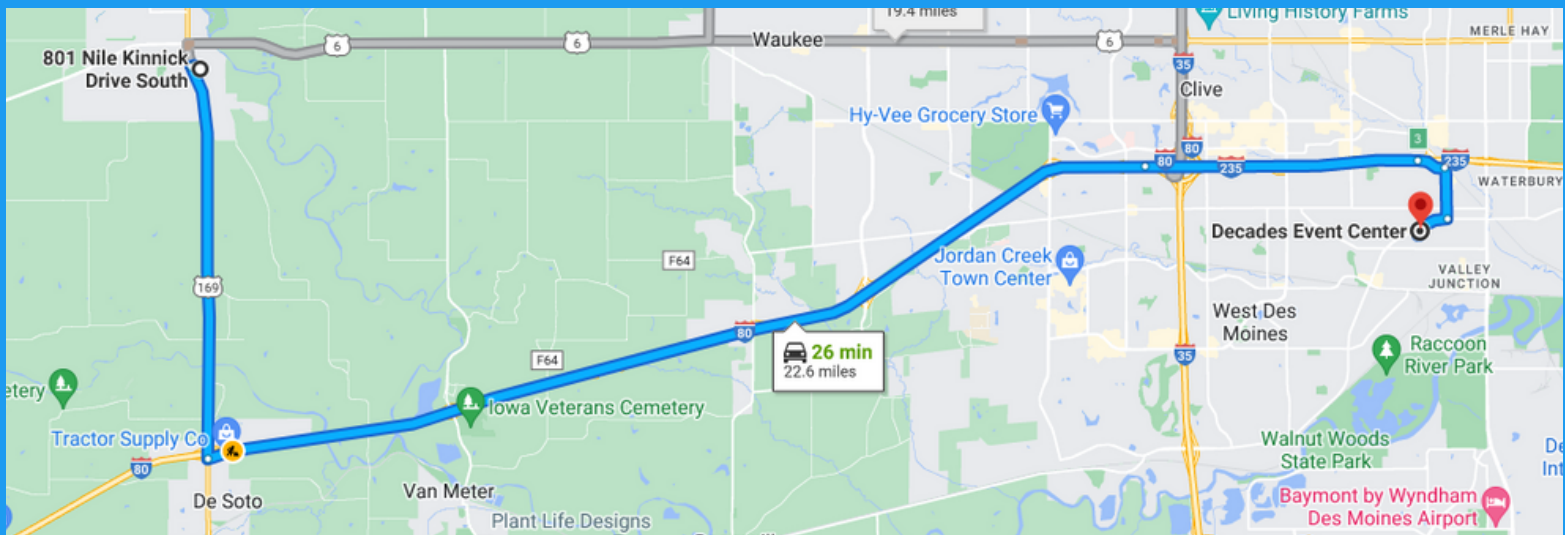

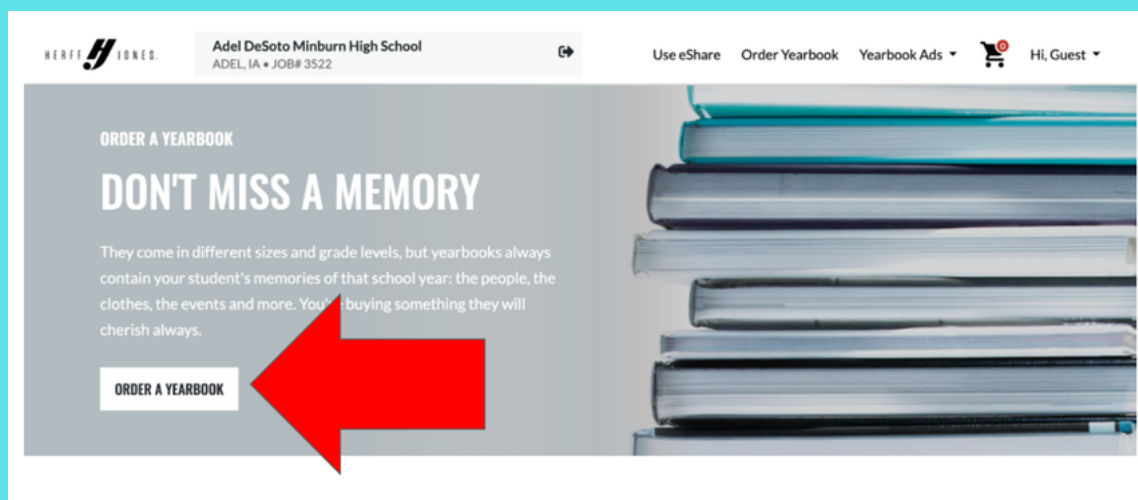

Small: 1/8 page, up to 2 images = \$45

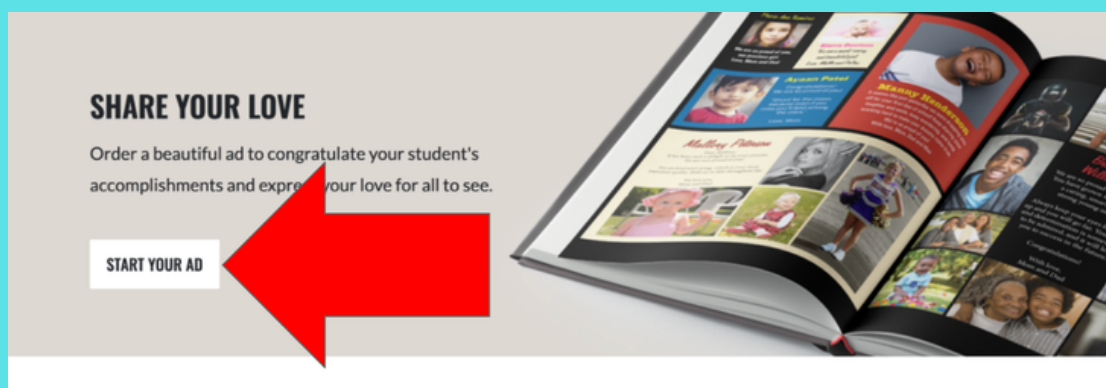
Medium: 1/4 page, up to 3 images = \$85

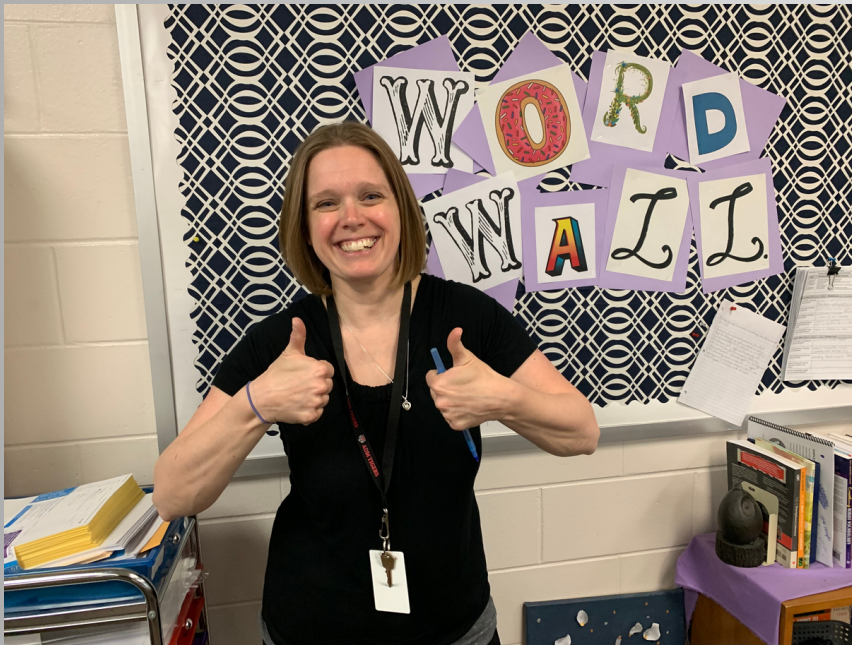
