However, performance on a standardized test does provide valuable and essential information on how individual students are performing on key skills and, more importantly, how students as a whole are performing throughout our system. We don't shy away from the aspiration to have ALL students proficient or above on these tests. It is one important way of evaluating how close we are to meeting our mission of having all students learn at high levels.

Facility Master Planning: Update

We have finished the initial visioning stage of the design process for the new high school. We are now engaged in the initial design process that focuses on trying to bring the ideas from the visioning committee, identified program needs, and other key priorities into a conceptual layout and floor plan of what the new high school could look like.

As part of this work we have started engaging a few small user groups for additional input on key areas of the new high school. Later this spring we will hold a series of larger user group meetings for even more detailed and specific feedback about the design and functionality of the building. This work continues to follow a similar process that was used in the design and development of Meadow View Elementary.



Safety and Security: Update

As was shared the past few months, we continue to be involved in the Governor's School Safety Program which will ultimately lead to funding for lowa schools to make safety improvements in all buildings. All five attendance centers have completed a formal safety assessment conducted by a vendor provided by the lowa Department of Homeland Security and received reports of findings and action steps from each safety assessment. We have used these reports to identify priority future projects to improve safety and security at each school building, submitted the grant application and last week received notice that our grant application had been approved. We will now move to the next phase of planning for the safety and security projects that were approved.

In January, ADM began a partnership with Family Connections, Inc. to provide in-person on-site mental health therapy services for students. Students may be referred for these services by the district or a family may express interest in services directly to Family Connections, Inc. Appointments take place on-site at ADM, with all payment and insurance logistics handled between Family Connections, Inc. and the student's family.
